IV. Any other submission

- 1. In January 2024 more tourist arrivals, but less tourist nights than in January 2023. In January 2024, there were 231 thousand tourist arrivals and 594 thousand tourist nights in commercial accommodation establishments, which was an increase in arrivals of 1.0%, but a decrease of nights of 1.2% compared to January 2023. Domestic tourists realised 113 thousand arrivals and 251 thousand nights in January 2024, which was 0.8% less tourist arrivals and 0.7% less nights compared to January 2023. Foreign tourists realised 118 thousand arrivals and 343 thousand nights in January 2024, which was 2.9% more arrivals, but 1.6% less tourist nights than in January 2023. The most foreign tourist nights in January 2024 were realised by tourists from Slovenia, as much as 47 thousand nights, which accounted for 13.6% of the total realised foreign tourist nights. Compared to January 2023, Slovenian tourists realised 8.1% less nights. These were followed by tourists from Germany (10.4%), Austria (10.3%), Italy (8.9%) and Bosnia and Herzegovina (7.4%). Tourists from all these countries realised less tourist nights in January 2024 than in January last year, except tourists from Bosnia and Herzegovina, who realised 3.8% more nights. The highest number of tourist nights in the first month of this year was realised in the City of Zagreb, 133 thousand nights, which was 22.4% of the total number of tourist nights realised in Croatia. Compared to January 2023, tourist nights increased by 4.5%. The City of Zagreb was followed by the County of Istria (123 thousand nights) and the County of Primorje-Gorski kotar (92 thousand nights). - 2. Prices 4.1% higher in February 2024 at the annual level. In February 2024 compared to February 2023 (at the annual level), the prices of goods and services for personal consumption, measured by the consumer price index, increased by 4.1% on average. Compared to January 2024 (at the monthly level), they increased by 0.2% on average. Observing the main divisions of the ECOICOP classification, at the annual level, the highest increase on average in consumer prices was recorded in the following divisions: Restaurants and hotels, of 10.4% (contribution to the growth of +0.53 percentage points), Miscellaneous goods and services, of 5.9% (+0.37 percentage points), Food and non-alcoholic beverages as well as Health, of 5.7% in each division (contribution to the growth of +1.51 percentage points in the division Food and non-alcoholic beverages and of +0.18 percentage points in division Health), Education, of 5.4% (+0.04 percentage points), Recreation and culture, of 4.9% (+0.25 percentage points), Transport, of 4.3% (+0.60 percentage points), and Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, of 4.0% (+0.20 percentage points). - **3. Average net earnings for January 2024 amounted to 1,239 euro.** The average monthly paid net earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities in the Republic of Croatia for January 2024 amounted to 1,239 euro, which represented a nominal increase of 4.0% and a real increase of

4.4% as compared to December 2023. The average monthly gross earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities in the Republic of Croatia for January 2024 amounted to 1,695 euro, which represented a nominal increase of 4.6% and a real increase of 5.0% as compared to December 2023. The highest average monthly paid net earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities for January 2024 were paid in the activity Air transport and amounted to 1,878 euro, while the lowest earnings were paid in the activity Manufacture of wearing apparel and amounted to 843 euro. The highest average monthly gross earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities for January 2024 were in the activity Air transport and amounted to 2,689 euro, while the lowest earnings were in the activity Manufacture of wearing apparel and amounted to 1,090 euro. The average monthly paid net earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities in the Republic of Croatia for January 2024 were 13.3% higher in nominal terms and 8.8% higher in real terms as compared to the same month of the previous year. The average monthly gross earnings per person in paid employment in legal entities in the Republic of Croatia for January 2024 were 13.1% higher in nominal terms and 8.6% higher in real terms as compared to the same month of the previous year. Median net earnings for January 2024 amounted to 1,059 euro, while median gross earnings amounted to 1,420 euro. (Source: Croatian Bureau of Statistics)

Lider.hr (Printed version, Full article), UNLIKE CROATIAN LEADERSHIP, INDIAN LEADERSHIP HAS VISION, KNOWLEDGE, AND COURAGE

A seven-day working visit to India might have convinced European journalists of the country's progress. Colleagues who were in New Delhi ten years ago testify that even then, on the way from the airport to the residential area, a lot of homeless people were sleeping on the sidewalks. Now they are no longer there. This does not mean that they are not there elsewhere. Extreme poverty still exists in parts of the cities. However, the impression is that things are changing.

Parliamentary elections are scheduled for April 19. The president of the country will not run as an opponent to the current prime minister. The Prime Minister is confident of securing his third mandate and expects a significant majority.

This scenario does not pertain to Croatia in any of the possibly existing parallel worlds, nor is it the prediction of a fortune teller who may have gotten a little carried away. The elections in question will take place in the largest democratic country - India.

By coincidence, the long-planned visit of a group of editors and journalists from Central and Eastern European countries coincided with the pre-election period in India. The almost certain winners are the incumbent Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his BJP party. Their goal is to secure at least 400 of the 544 seats in the lower house of the Indian parliament. In his two previous mandates, Modi has established a comfortable position for another victory through a combination of populism, nationalism, and successful management of economic growth, along with improvements in the standards of living for a large portion of the predominantly rural population.

Pronounced state planning

Of course, the hosts try to show the best to the journalists, but an hour's drive from the capital to, for example, Agra (Taj Mahal) reveals the average. Along the way, one can witness numerous brick kilns reminiscent of those from half a century ago, emitting black coal smoke. Nevertheless, the areas we passed through and explored generally surprise with the absence of the expected dirt. One encounters much messier cities in other countries. It would be presumptuous to claim that a complex

country like India can be fully understood after just a few days' stay. Therefore, these are merely impressions.

In the itinerary of our visit, it was indicated that we would visit the National Human Rights Commission of India. For us Europeans, this suggested a discussion about relations with national minorities. However, we soon realized that this encompassed megaprograms addressing rights that are often taken for granted in our countries: the right to adequate housing, access to clean drinking water, and functional sanitation facilities. The focus lies on the seven hundred million people living in villages.

Well, it turns out that it also concerns women's rights. If women no longer have to go to distant water sources, they have free time for activities such as education.

In another institution, the Agency for attracting investments (abolished in Croatia a long time ago), it is outlined which foreign investments can be made automatically (such as pharmaceuticals, civil aviation industry, and oil industry), and which ones require special government permits (telecommunications, defense, and banking). There are also restrictions on insurance and pension funds. Foreigners are prohibited from investing in gambling and print media.

There is a strongly pronounced state planning, along with complex and difficult-to-understand relations with private Indian companies that must align with government goals. Many corruption scandals suggest that impressive economic growth is achieved in ways that are not officially foreseen.

A visit to Hyderabad, a vibrant center of finance and modern industries with a population of seven million, is also impressive. Enormous industrial complexes (close to the city center by Indian standards, barely forty kilometers away), numerous residential complexes whose buildings can be several times larger than Zagreb's Mamutica, crowds of young people on the streets... can cause us from aging Europe to feel powerless.

Size is no excuse

That's the wrong approach. There are 380 Indians for every inhabitant of Croatia. It is as if we are a micro-company with ten employees, and they are a corporation with 3,800 people.

A micro-enterprise operates differently than a corporation. If Indians can effectively manage 1.4 billion people, shouldn't it be easier to manage 3.8 million people? Obviously, one of the key differences lies in leadership - whether it possesses vision, knowledge, and courage.

What can be observed in India, which is lacking in Croatia, are public calls for collective goal achievement. For instance, the aim to achieve a per capita income of \$12,000 by 2047 is accompanied by messages like, "Let's do it together! Get involved!"

The problem is that the authorities in Croatia would have to finally set themselves measurable goals. And the citizens, even the target groups, would have to believe in the sincere commitment of the government to do something in the common interest. The excuse that Croatia's population is smaller, with less than four million people compared to India's 1.4 billion, is no excuse. (22/03)

f) Sectoral insight from Croatia

Croatia Consumer Outlook

Fitch holds a positive outlook for Croatia's consumer activity over 2024, with support for spending and confidence coming from a strengthening economic backdrop, easing inflation and jobs and earnings growth. Consumer confidence has been improving steadily over the last few months of 2023 and with inflation easing over the same period, this bodes well for spending power in 2024. Risks remain balanced with potential downsides from sustained high energy prices and tight eurozone financial conditions, and upsides from possible higher tourism arrivals as real wage growth in the eurozone accelerates.

Consumer Spending Outlook For 2024

Croatia consumer activity is forecast to grow in 2024 although the pace of expansion will be slightly slower than in 2023. Fitch expects that real household spending will expand by 3.3% y-o-y to reach EUR44.0bn. This is down from the 3.6% y-o-y posted in 2023 as base effects wear off. While real spending growth is on an upwards trajectory beyond 2024, it remains below pre-Covid levels, where real household spending grew by an annual average of 3.7% y-o-y over 2015-2019, as still-elevated inflation weighs on real gains.

Consumer confidence, at latest reading of -9.5 in March 2024 (most recent data), is a notable increase from -21.7 in March 2023. The general upward trajectory in consumer confidence is driven by a combination of improving economic backdrop, easing inflation, steady interest rates and growth in earnings. The country's January 2023 ascension in the EU's Schengen Area and reduced VAT for energy products caps remaining until April 2024 are also a positive for consumers. Additionally, the government's openness to foreign workers should help counterbalance the effects of labour shortages and emigration by supplementing the domestic workforce. As confidence improves, retail sales are also growing, with the February 2024 figure showing a 9.1% y-o-y increase (most recent data). This is a further and marked improvement on the 0.4% y-o-y growth in February 2023. Consumer confidence is still well-below pre-Covid levels (the index reached a high of 1.0 in January 2020), but Fitch believes the index will continue to improve over the next 12 months and will drive further growth in retail sales.

Inflation Outlook

Inflation in Croatia has peaked and is now continuing its downward trajectory. Latest data, at 4.1% y-o-y in March 2024, is the third month in a row of stabilised year-on-year inflation and well below the peak of 13.5% y-o-y reported in November 2022. Fitch's Country Risk team forecasts this easing of inflation to continue over 2024, reaching a low of 2.7% y-o-y by the end of the year. This will put average inflation at 3.6% y-o-y in 2024, down from the 8.4% y-o-y average in 2023. Although an electricity cap for both households and businesses is due to expire on September 30, gas prices and reduced VAT for energy products will remain capped until April 2024, which will help mitigate pressures on purchasing power. However, it is still worth noting that these levels are still considerably higher than what households have become accustomed to, where inflation averaged just 0.6% y-o-y between 2015 and 2019. As such, inflation will continue to act as a drag on consumer spending and a key risk to outlook in the short term.

Employment Outlook

Many markets have experienced robust labour market dynamics since the Covid-19 pandemic. These have been driven by rapid economic recoveries both locally and globally. Governments have supported local labour markets, leading to a tightening that has supported the rise in nominal wage. Although inflation is eroding real income gains, the strong labour market was a principal driver behind consumer spending growth throughout 2022 and 2023. However, as major markets and economies decelerate in 2024, Fitch anticipates a general rise in unemployment rates. Diminished levels of personal savings, which previously served as a cushion to uphold current consumption patterns, will necessitate households to re-orientate their purchasing behaviours and curtail their expenditure – either by shifting to lower price points, or by acquiring fewer goods at similar spending levels. Consequently, rising unemployment is a key risk to Fitch's consumer outlook for 2024. The unemployment rate in Croatia has now reached 6.7% in February 2024 (latest available data), a still-low rate but higher than earlier in the cycle when it stood at 5.6% in June 2023.

Income Outlook

This tighter labour market has been feeding through into stronger nominal wages overall, which have risen from an average of 8.2% y-o-y growth over Q422 to 14.5% y-o-y growth average over Q423. Latest data for January 2024 show nominal wages growth has slowed slightly to 13.3% y-o-y. The slowdown in real wage growth comes as inflation continues to ease, ensuring less upward pressure on earnings. Fitch continues to forecast positive wage growth for 2024 as a whole, which will supplement disposable incomes and support consumer spending over this period. However, improvements to household wealth are unlikely to be significant over the long term. Fitch expects successive administrations to restrict public sector pay packages and attempt to reduce the influence of the country's strong labour unions.
