1.	Trade	The Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy (MOTIE) announced on March 1 that Korea's export value for February 2024 increased 4.8% year-on-year to USD 52.4 billion. Imports decreased 13.1% to \$48.1 billion and the trade balance stood at a surplus of \$4.3 billion.	<p>February monthly exports recorded growth for the fifth consecutive month, despite the seasonal factors and relatively lower number of working days due to the Seollal holidays having landed in January last year. Factoring in the number of working days, the average daily export value (\$2.6 billion) for February climbed 12.5% year-on-year and 12.2% month-on-month.</p> <p>Displays (up 20.2%) and computers (up 18.4%) both posted double-digit growth and advanced for the seventh and second consecutive month, respectively.</p> <p>For wireless communication devices, smartphones gained 57.5%, but exports of parts dropped 31.9%, resulting in a 16.5% fall overall. Exports of general machinery (up 1.2%), ships (up 27.7%) and bio health (up 9.3%) improved for the 11th, seventh and fourth consecutive month, respectively. Automobile exports showed a temporary decline of 7.8% due to the Seollal holidays and some automakers' production line maintenance work.</p> <p>Exports to China (down 2.4%) were affected by the Spring Festival holiday,</p>

		<p>but the daily average export grew 4.8% to approximately \$0.5 billion. Korea's trade balance with China snapped the downward streak for the first time in 17 months, recording a \$0.2 billion surplus.</p> <p>Exports to the U.S. posted an all-time high for the month of February, reaching \$9.8 billion (up 9.0%) and continued on the growth streak for the seventh consecutive month. Exports to Japan (up 1.0%) and ASEAN (up 1.4%) grew for the fifth consecutive month, while those to Latin America (up 25.1%) advanced for the second consecutive month.</p> <p>Korea's February imports declined 13.1% year-on-year to \$48.1 billion. The import of crude oil (up 0.9%) inched up, but that of gas (down 48.6%) and coal (down 17.3%) dropped, contracting overall energy imports by 21.2%.</p>
2.	Investment	Total investment made by Korea to India amounted to \$452.92 million during January-December 2023, latest data as of March 2024. Majority of the investment came from manufacturing. Cumulative investment since 1980 stands at \$8.22 billion.

Jaishankar, and Senior Officials from the Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), and NITI Aayog visited the Republic of Korea on 5 <sup>th</sup> March. The purpose of the visit was to participate at the 10 <sup>th</sup> India-Republic of Korea Joint Commission meeting (JCM), which Dr. Jaishankar co-chaired alongside Mr. Cho Tae-yul, the ROK Foreign Minister. The delegation also engaged in fruitful discussions with Mr. Ahn Duk-geun, the Industry Minister from the Ministry of Trade, Industry & Energy (MOTIE). Additionally, an EAM delivered a public address, titled 'Broadening Horizons: India-Korea Partnership in the Indo-Pacific', at Korea National Diplomatic Academy (KNDA), which was co-organized by the Embassy and KNDA. This address underscored the expanding scope of cooperation between India and Korea, particularly in the Indo-Pacific region.
