Imports jumped by 30.5%, boosted by purchases of manufactured products (+29.9%), mining products (+45.4%) and agricultural goods (+30%). Exports advanced at a slower 8.4%, as stronger shipments of manufactured products (+24.8%) and agricultural goods (+38.4%) more than offset a decline in mining products (-30.2%). Among major trading partners, imports increased mostly from China (+54.2%), the US (+21.2%) and the EU (+19.3%). Overseas sales rose primarily to the US (+22.8%), Argentina (+34.3%) and the EU (+9.9%), but declined to China (-17.5%).
2.	Trade in services	The service sector experienced some deceleration, however it is still maintaining a trajectory of growth. This ascension direction is expected to continue.	The Global Brazil Services PMI eased in August of 2022 in comparison in the previous month, the lowest level since February but still marking the 14th consecutive period of growth. Robust demand has once again assisted the service sector, with a rise in output followed by another significant increase in the number of new hires. On the price front, reduced fuel taxes continued to curb inflation, with the respective growth rates in input costs and output charges easing to 22- and six-month lows. Finally, service providers remained confident about the output levels during the next 12 months, hoping that economic recovery and

			easing political concerns will continue to support higher business activity.
3.	Investments	Foreign Direct Investment in the Country is increasing and are at a satisfactory level, however it has not yet recovered pre-pandemic levels.	According to data from the world's main economies compiled by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) and the Brazilian Central Bank, Brazil was the fourth country with the highest volume of foreign investment in the first quarter of 2022. The country attracted US\$ 27.88 billion in foreign investment between January and March 2022. As a result, it was behind only China, the United States and Australia, but ahead of other OECD member countries. Mexico ranked fifth. Also according to the organization's data, in 2021 Brazil was also in fourth place in the global ranking, when it received US\$ 50.36 billion in investments. The country lagged behind the United States, China and Canada. Considering the proportion between foreign investments that entered a country and its Gross Domestic Product (GDP), Brazil had the best performance among the 15 largest economies in the world. The proportion stood at 3.1%, surpassing that of countries such as Canada (3%), China (2%), the United States (1.8%) and Japan (0.5%).

Minutes of the Monetary Policy Committee – Copom (2-3 August, 2022)

Domestically, the set of economic activity indicators released since the last Monetary Policy Committee meeting continues to show growth throughout the second quarter, with a stronger recovery in the labor market than what was expected by the Committee. Both indicators regarding the hiring of formal employment and the occupancy and unemployment rates suggest a rapid normalization of labor-intensive sectors after the pandemic. Consumer inflation remains high, with an increase spread across several components, proving to be more persistent than anticipated. Inflation expectations for 2022, 2023 and 2024 determined by the Focus survey are around 7.2%, 5.3% and 3.3%, respectively.
