1.	Trade in goods	Brazil's trade surplus shrank in September of 2022 from USD in the corresponding month of the previous year. Imports increased Exports advanced major import partners are China, the US and the EU. Major exports partners are the EU, Argentina and the US.	Brazil's trade surplus shrank to USD 3.99 billion in September of 2022 from USD 4.4 billion in the corresponding month of the previous year, below market expectations. Imports jumped by 24.9% to USD 24.95 billion, boosted by purchases of manufactured products (+24.7%), mining products (+40.6%), and agricultural goods (+7.6%). Meanwhile, exports advanced at 18.8% to USD 28.95 billion, as stronger shipments of manufactured products (+22.3%) and agricultural goods (+47.5%) more than offset a decline in mining products (-4.1%). Among major trading partners, imports increased mostly from China (+26.7%), the US (+19.0%), and the EU (+22.2%), while overseas sales rose primarily to the EU (+50.5%), Argentina (+47.1%), the US (+14.3%), as sales to China declined (-5.5%).
2.	Trade in services	Slowing growth in services activity since May of 2021. The rate of job creation was solid. Business sentiment remained well.	The latest reading of the services sector pointed to the third consecutive month of slowing growth in services activity and to the greatest extent since May of 2021. New business growth moderated amid waning demand and election uncertainty. Meanwhile, the rate of job creation was solid, but the weakest in eight months. Subsequently outstanding business decreased at a survey-record pace. On the price front, there were softer increases in input costs and output charges, the slowest in 25 and 20 months respectively, amid tax cuts and contained fuel prices. Lastly, business sentiment remained well inside the positive territory in September, being at its third-highest level since July 2019, on hopes of more stable conditions after the

			presidential elections and prospects of improvement in domestic consumption.
3.	Investment	Interest rate is steady at 13.75%. Monetary policy committee inflation projections stand at 5.8% for 2022, 4.6% for 2023, and 2.8% for 2024.	The Central Bank of Brazil decided to keep the Selic rate steady at 13.75% on September 21st, 2022, as widely expected. Copom's inflation projections stand at 5.8% for 2022, 4.6% for 2023, and 2.8% for 2024. Regarding the Brazilian economy, policymakers noted that it remains resilient while the most recent indicators continued to indicate growth.
