Economy:

1. Jambi's Export Value Increases by 13.97 Percent

Jambi, (Metro Jambi):

Until August 2022, Jambi Province's export value reached US\$

312.46 million. This figure increased by 13.97 percent from the export achievement in last July. Head of the Central Statistics Agency (BPS) of Jambi Province Agus Sudibyo said that there are several commodities that are Jambi's mainstay for export abroad. Some of the main export destination countries for Jambi Province are Singapore, India, Malaysia, Thailand and Japan.

2. Bappenas RI Promotes Six Economic Transformation Strategies for the Riau Archipelago

Tanjungpinang, (Antara):

The Ministry of National Development Planning of the Republic Development Agency Indonesia/National Planning least (PPN/Bappenas) carries out at six economic transformation strategies for the Riau Islands Province. Minister Suharso added that with the six strategies, it is hoped that Riau Islands growth will accelerate and with this economic transformation scenario, it can reach a per capita income of USD 41,946 per capita in 2045 or equivalent to the current Italian economy.

3. SKIPM: West Sumatra's Fishery Exports Increased in September

Padang, (Antara):

The Fish Quarantine Station and Quality Control and Safety of Fishery Products (SKIPM) Padang, West Sumatra noted that the export of fishery products from the province to overseas experienced an increase in September 2022 when compared to the previous month. Head of SKIPM Padang, Abdur Rohman in Padang, Sunday (9/10) said that the total export value of West Sumatra's fishery products in September was Rp. 9.1 billion, while exports of fishery products in August were only Rp. 6.6

million, then in July 2022 it reached Rp. 3.9. billion.

The production value of fish caught by fishermen who carry out unloading at the Sungailiat Archipelago Fishery Port, Bangka Belitung Islands Province from January to September 2022 reached more than Rp79.4 billion. 6. Lampung Export Value Shows Positive Trend Bandar Lampung, (Antara):

The export value of oil and gas and non-oil and gas commodities in Lampung Province in 2021 shows a positive trend reaching 4.84 billion US dollars. Head of the Central Statistics Agency (BPS) of Lampung Province, Endang Retno Sri

Subiyandani, in Bandarlampung, Thursday (13/10) said that the main export destinations for Lampung Province are Italy, the United States, India, China, the Netherlands, Pakistan, Japan, South Korea, Spain, and New Zealand. Endang added that an increase also occurred in Lampung Province imports, the import value in 2021 reached 2.22 billion dollars while in 2020 it reached 1.34 billion dollars.

The value of exports through loading ports in the North Sumatra region in August 2022 increased by 16.85 percent. Compared to July 2022, which was US\$1.25 billion, it is now US\$1.35 billion. So the increase in North Sumatra's exports rose by 7.78 percent. The head of the North Sumatra BPS, Nurul Hasanudin in Medan on Saturday (15/10) said that when compared to August 2021, North Sumatra's exports increased by 16.85 percent.

8. Largest Nationally, Bumdes Annual Turnover in Riau Province Reaches IDR 149 Billion

Pekanbaru, (Sumatra): Village-Owned Enterprises (BUMDes) in Riau Province managed to achieve the largest turnover in Indonesia, reaching Rp149 billion. Riau Governor Syamsuar gave appreciation and certificates of appreciation to 643 BUMDes food business units in Riau Province which achieved an annual turnover of Rp. 149 billion. The award was given symbolically by Governor Syamsuar to several BUMDes including Raja Bejamu Mandiri Bumdes Rokan Hilir Regency,

Lancang Kuning Regency Bumdes Indragiri Hilir, Koto Panjang Bumdes Agreed Kampar Regency, Bakti Pertiwi Bumdes Meranti Islands Regency, BUMDes Harapan Makmur Kuansing Regency, took place in Dang Merdu Tower Auditorium of Bank Riau Kepri (BRK) Syariah, Saturday (15/10).

9. Natura Is the Largest Contributor of Fishery Production in Riau Islands

Tanjungpinang, (Suara):

Capture fisheries and aquaculture production produced by Natuna Regency in 2021 is the largest in the Riau Islands Province. Head of the Maritime Affairs and Fisheries Service (DKP) of the Riau Islands Province, Arif Fadillah, Tanjungpinang, Wednesday (19/10) said that the production value of capture fisheries and aquaculture produced by Natuna Regency in 2021 is the largest in the Riau Islands Province. Overall, the production value of capture fisheries in the area reached Rp. 8,697 trillion and the value of aquaculture production reached Rp. 610 billion. Arif said that the aquaculture area based on the Zoning Plan for Coastal Zone and Small Islands (RZWP3K), also places Natuna Regency as having the largest aquaculture area, reaching 41,669 hectares. He said that currently the Riau Islands Provincial Government continues to maximize maritime potential in Riau Islands in accordance with the mission of accelerating maritime-based economic growth, environmental insight, and advantages to increase community prosperity. This is in accordance with the geographical conditions of the Riau Islands which only have a land area of 4 percent and the remaining 96 percent are water areas. Especially with the potential for fisheries in Natuna Regency which can be declared as a national fish barn, a strategic plan on integrated fisheries in the outer islands is very necessary.
