1.	300490 Pharmaceutical Products (3004)	Indian pharma sector has a market share of about 38% and there are around 50 Indian pharma companies like Zydus, Dr Reddy's, Cipla, Sun Pharma etc. that have presence in Myanmar. Zydus has also invested in Myanmar by setting up of a plant at Thilawa for USD 23 Million. Exports of pharmaceuticals increased from US\$ 221.78 million in 2019-20 to US\$ 322 Million in 2021-22.
2.	271019 (Other Petroleum Oils and Oils obtained from Bituminous Minerals)	India's export of these products in 2018-19 was US\$145.04 million which decreased in 2019-20 to US\$17.07 million. Myanmar's fuel requirement before COVID was around 600 Kilo Tonne (KT) per month. Around 60% of these requirements were sourced from Singapore. After declaration of emergency in Myanmar, demand of fuel has declined to 300 KT per month. Also, there is some issue in importing it from Singapore now. It was found that there is a good scope for increasing India's fuel oil export to Myanmar.
3.	271012 (Light Oils and Preparations)	India's export of these products in 2018-19 was US\$52.54 million. But there was no export in 2019-20. Indian companies can explore the market.
4.	210690 (Food Preparations)	There is potential market for food preparations products in Myanmar. Indian exporters can enhance their market share in this area. India's export of Food Preparations in 2021-22 (April-Jan) has reached US\$6.7 million.
5.	Motorcycles and automobile parts	Motorcycles; parts and accessories have good potential in Myanmar. Numbers of vehicles used in Myanmar have increased remarkably. Indian spare parts of automobile have good scope in Myanmar.
6.	Agriculture Machinery (8433)	Myanmar's major import items in the agricultural sector are power tillers, hand tractors, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, diesel oil, dumpers, loaders and spare parts, water pumps, hydraulic excavators, gear box assembly for hand tractors, MS rod & mild steel and hybrid.
7.	Iron & Steel (72)	Indian steel has advantage of less voyage time (4-5 days) compared to of Chinese (around 30 days). Myanmar importers prefer Indian steel due to its reputation of better quality. China is leading supplier of iron & steel. India can increase its share in Myanmar's global import of iron & steel.
8.	Maize (Corn) Seed (100510)	It is observed that export of Maize (Corn) seed from India to Myanmar has increased in CFY compared to last FY.
9.	Oil Cake (2304, 2305 & 2306)	Myanmar's global import of Oil Cake (230400) during June 2021 was of US\$44.55 million. There is good scope for increasing India's export of oil cake to Myanmar. We held meetings with Myanmar Livestock Federation and Animal

		Feed Association to explore the possibility to enhance India's export of oil meals to Myanmar.
10.	Plastic Raw Material (39)	Myanmar has restricted import of finished goods to enhance their domestic economic activities and domestic production. Hence there is greater demand for raw materials for different industries. Myanmar Plastics Industries Association has shown interest in supply of raw material for plastic from India.
11.	Motor Vehicles with only Electric motor (HS Code 8703)	There is a huge potential market for supply of electric vehicles to Myanmar as Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) released a notification dated 15 February, 2023 that it will give priority to electric vehicles (EVs) and related business sectors. The Notification No. 90/2022 for determining the Tariff rate reduction to 0% for the various types of battery electric vehicles (BEV) was issued since November, 2022. Enterprises executing installation, manufacturing and restoration services of the EVs, renewable electricity generation, EVs charging service businesses, electric vehicle battery production, EV battery and related service business, electric bus operation services, electric taxi and transportation service businesses and scientific research development business are included in those priority sectors.
12.	Cement and other construction material (HS Code 8417)	Indian cement manufacturers have good potential as the construction sector here imports cement and other construction material etc. from the foreign countries. Myanmar brought in about 100,000 tonnes of cement in September 2022 from foreign countries.
