

Economy news highlights of Equatorial Guinea :

(1) The multinational Trafigura has proposed a loan of 2 billion dollars to Equatorial Guinea for the development of the hydrocarbon sector in the country. This was stated by the Vice President of the Swiss firm, James Josling, during the meeting he held with the Vice President of Equatorial Guinea and the heads of the Ministries of Hydrocarbons, Treasury, Gepetrol and Sonagas.

Trafigura's Swiss branch handles a significant part of the company's oil, metals and minerals trading. In addition, Switzerland, with its favourable business environment and position as a global financial centre, provides Trafigura with a strategic setting for coordinating its trading and logistics operations. The Swiss subsidiary is also responsible for establishing and maintaining relationships with key clients and partners in Europe, the Middle East and Africa.

(2) Equatorial Guinea has become the 159th country to join the World Bank's investor-state dispute resolution institution .

On July 24, 2024, the Republic of Equatorial Guinea deposited its instrument of ratification of the Convention on the Settlement of Investment Disputes between States and Nationals of Other States (the ICSID Convention) with the World Bank. Equatorial Guinea becomes the 159th State to ratify the ICSID Convention. Pursuant to Article 68(2) of the ICSID Convention, the Convention will enter into force with respect to the Republic of Equatorial Guinea on 23 August 2024. The ICSID Convention provides the institutional and legal framework for the settlement of disputes involving foreign investments. It was created to facilitate investment between countries by providing an independent and depoliticized forum for arbitration, conciliation, mediation and fact-finding. As a Contracting State to the ICSID Convention, Equatorial Guinea will participate in ICSID governance through its representative—and one vote—on the Administrative Council. Its responsibilities include adopting the procedural rules applicable to ICSID cases, and electing the Secretary-General and Deputy Secretaries-General of ICSID. ICSID Member States also have the right to appoint arbitrators and conciliators to serve on the ICSID Panels.

(3) Equatorial Guinea and Nigeria sign an agreement to build a gas pipeline in the Gulf of Guinea, marking a new era of bilateral cooperation.

In an effort to strengthen bilateral cooperation in West Africa, Equatorial Guinea and Nigeria have signed an agreement for the construction of the **Gulf of Guinea Gas Pipeline** Project . The project, a regional joint gas pipeline project, will transport gas from Nigeria to Equatorial Guinea. Under the terms of the agreement, the gas will be processed at Equatorial Guinea's LNG processing facility at Punta Europa on Bioko Island (owned by state-owned EG LNG), signaling new opportunities for energy security through bilateral collaboration. The agreement, signed by the presidents of Equatorial Guinea, Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, and the Republic of Nigeria, Bola Ahmed Tinubu, this week, outlines plans for a gas pipeline, an LNG feed stock plant and the sale of gas to power companies and industrial users, ensuring energy security and regional trade in West Africa. This agreement marks an important milestone in Equatorial Guinea's GMH initiative, reinforcing our position as a regional leader in gas monetization.

(4) Equatorial Guinea ratifies amendments to the Convention on International Civil Aviation - ICAO

On 1 August 2024, the Republic of Equatorial Guinea deposited the instruments of ratification of two protocols of amendment to the Convention on International Civil Aviation , both signed in Montreal on 6 October 2016. These amendments correspond to articles 50(a) and 56 of the Convention. With these ratifications, Equatorial Guinea became the 100th member of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) to ratify these protocols. The Protocol to amend Article 50(a) proposes to increase the number of members of the ICAO Council from thirty-six to forty. The Protocol to amend Article 56 proposes to increase the number of members of the Air Navigation Commission from nineteen to twenty-one. The ICAO Assembly, by resolutions A39-5 and A39-7, recommends that all States ratify these protocols as a matter of urgency.

(5) The Director General of the National Institute of Statistics of Equatorial Guinea, reported on the quarterly national accounts for the Second Quarter of 2024. The report indicates that the Gross Domestic Product (GFP) registered a growth of 3.5% in the second quarter of 2024 compared to the same quarter of the previus year, and increased by 4.5% compared to the previous quarter.
