





Overview of General Barriers to FDI in Hungary:

Regulatory barriers and administrative burden are affecting all sectors but particularly energy, construction, and banking: The overall administrative burden, including start-ups, negatively affects investment decisions. The instability of the regulatory framework, with frequent and unpredictable regulatory changes, creates uncertainty for investors and is hindering both internal investment and FDIs.

The Hungarian government imposes a 100% offset requirement for defined sector investments over HUF 1bln (EUR 2.8 mln). Efficiency of procedures in construction and environmental permits is insufficient; corruption also raises risk for investors. There is no requirement that investors must purchase from local sources, but the EU Rules of origin applies.

Ownership restrictions (all non-EU)

according to the 2014 Land Law, only private Hungarian or EU citizens resident in Hungary with a minimum of three years experience of working in agriculture or holding degree in agriculture can purchase farmland, which is limited to 300 hectares. All others may lease farmland. All farmland purchases must be approved by a local land committee and Hungarian authorities, local farmers and young farmers must be offered a chance to purchase the land first. Up to 1200 hectares for a maximum of 20 years may be leased.

Price controls in consumer facing sectors and others considered to be of strategic importance.

The Hungarian government regulates the prices of certain goods, setting the upper and lower limits to which the private sector must adhere. Sectors include energy, pharmaceuticals. Cuts on regulated utilities prices have put considerable pressure on private utilities companies, decreasing profit margins and adding to an increasingly difficult operating environment.

State intervention in Banking, energy, agriculture, media, telecommunications, and retail sectors.

Since 2012 government has invested in state-owned enterprises with the objective of lessening the participation of foreign-owned competitors, especially in the energy sector. From 1 Jan 2019, the chemical industry, the telecom sector, vehicle construction, metallurgy, optics and electric equipment production, the defence industry, water and sewage management, the financial sector, food industry and agriculture, production of construction materials, state administration, health care, wage management, transport and tourism sectors have been added. Foreign investors in the targeted sectors have expressed concerns that the tax regime has become unpredictable and the additional levies appear to have been aimed against some industries with a high level of foreign ownership.

Basic Rules of The Protection of Strategic assets Concerning Foreign investments

The European Commission has issued Communication 2020/C 99 i/01 in which it has given guidance to the Member States of the EU concerning the protection of Europe's strategic assets from the foreign direct investment, ahead of the application of Regulation (EU) 2019/452 (FDI Screening Regulation) which is applicable from 11 October 2020.Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/1298 of 13 July 2020 amended the Annex to Regulation (EU) 2019/452.

Hungary first adopted FDI screening mechanisms by act LVII of 2018 for FDIs violating the security interests of the country, then in the economic crisis caused by COVID-19, further screening rules were adopted for FDIs by Government Decree nr. 227/2020. (V.25.). According to the above, certain transactions concerning Hungarian-seated companies operated in strategic sectors by foreign investors shall be reported to the Minister of Finance and the acknowledgement of the Minister of Finance is necessary for the realisation of the acquisition of the shares until 31 December 2020. These transactions include the acquisition of shares, the increase of the registered capital and the transformation of the company. The strategic sectors specified by the Government Decree include energy, communication, finance, agriculture and food industry, healthcare, construction, transport industry, tourism, IT, mechanical engineering, etc. Those foreign investors that have shares in a company registered in the EU, European economic Community or in Switzerland shall only report the transaction if majority interest will be acquired indirectly. Conversely, the foreign investors wishing to acquire shares in a Hungarian company directly have to report any transactions by which the foreign investor would acquire shares at a ratio of at least 10% and the value of the investment is at least 350 000 000 HUF (appx EUR 1 mln). The Minister of Finance has 45 days or in specific and duly justified cases 60 days to decide on the acknowledgement of the transaction. Should the Minister provide a negative decision, then the exact reason of the prohibition is not required to be mentioned. Aggrieved investor may appeal before The metropolitan Court for a review of the prohibiting decision.

Banking, agriculture, defence and energy

The Hungarian government has publicly declared that reducing foreign bank market share in the Hungarian financial sector and tightening regulations governing NGOs are key priority areas. Several state-led initiatives over the past several years targeted the banking sector and reduced foreign participation.

1. Growth in Tourism boosts economy: The number of nights spent in domestic tourist accommodation in the first eight months of 2024 was up 5.5% yr/yr driven by rising real wages, improved consumer confidence, and a surge in foreign visitors, according to the KSH and the National Tourist Information Centre. August alone saw 2.6 mln visitors, marking an 11% increase compared to 2023. Overall, domestic accommodation providers recorded over 7 mln guest nights in August. Domestic tourists accounted to 1.4 mln guests and 3.9 mln nights in August, while foreign visitors reached 1.2 mln, up 14% from last year. Passenger traffic at Budapest's Liszt Ferenc International Airport also surged by 18.6% in the first 8 months of 2024, further highlighting the sector's recovery. The government has launched Ft 15 bln worth of programmes to boost tourism, aiming for 50 mln overnight stays by 2030, and increasing the sector's share of GDP to 16%. However, rising costs are challenging profit margins for some operators, especially outside Budapest.

2. Inflation slows in September to 3%: Consumer prices were up 3% yr/yr in September, the lowest figure since January 2021, driven by the decline of fuel prices, the KSH said. Prices were 0.1% lower, on average, than in August. Core inflation, which excludes volatile fuel and food prices, rose from 4.6% in August to 4.8%, largely due to base effects. Food prices rose 3.7% in annual terms and were up 1.0% month-on-month, household energy prices were 5.0% lower, yr/yr but 0.2% higher than in August. Consumer durables dragged down the headline figure by 0.2% in annual terms. Disinflation in fuel prices continued, as prices were down 0.1% month-on-month and by 2.5% yr/yr. As in earlier months, services prices remained elevated, rising 8.4% yr/yr, but down 0.8% from the previous month. Headline inflation has probably reached its low point for the year and is on track to rebound to 4.0-4.5% in annual terms by the end of the year, analysts say.

3. Airport passenger traffic up 20%: Passenger traffic at Budapest's Liszt Ferenc Airport was 20% higher in the third quarter than one year earlier, at 5.161 mln airport operator Vinci Airports announced. Traffic was 9.9% higher than in the third quarter of 2019, before the pandemic. In the first three quarters of this year, 13.2 mln passengers used the airport, up by 19% from a year earlier and up by 7.8% from the same period in 2019. The airport's two main airlines significantly increased their seat capacity this year, Wizz Air by 32% and Ryanair by 22%.

4. Nagy lowers Q3 GDP growth forecast to **1.5%**: Hungary's third-quarter GDP will under perform the market consensus, coming in at around zero, while full-year growth will be under 1.5%, Economy Minister Marton Nagy said. The projection was revised down from around 2% due to weaker industrial exports, he added.

Nagy said economic growth could accelerate to 3.4% in 2025 and possibly reach 5-6% with the rebound of the global economy.

From the Indian side, delegates from from the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, New Delhi, ICAR, and Ministry of Information Technology (MeITY) as well as representative from the Embassy of Hungary, New Delhi joined. From the Hungarian side also there were representatives from various departments and concerned institutions. The discussions were completed in a friendly and congenial atmosphere. Both sides agreed on

			the need to further deepen cooperation in areas of mutual interest. Followed by a brief panel discussion between the two sides, the final Protocol was signed by H.E. Mr. Peter Sztaray, State Secretary for Security Policy and Energy Security, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and Mr. Rajendra Ratnoo, Joint Secretary, DPIIT on 18th October 2022. The Indian delegation met with investors and some members of the Indian business community in Hungary on the evening on 17th October. Mr. Ratnoo give a brief overview of the business environment in India, the policy initiatives of the Government of India and the economic growth and prospects of India. He mentioned several schemes open for investors to take advantage of in India like the Make in India initiative, Smart Cities, New Logistics Policy, Atma Nirbhar Bharat, PM Ghati Shakti, productivity Linked incentive schemes etc. The delegation also had a meeting with HIPA on 18th afternoon where they discussed ideas how to enhance investments and promote cooperation between the two countries. The next round of the JCEC is to be held in H1 of 2025 in New Delhi.

1. IMF more pessimistic about growth: The IMF's revised World Economic Outlook forecast calculates that Hungary's GDP growth will be 1.5% this year, less than the 2.2% which was forecast in April. The IMF also revised its 2025 growth forecast for Hungary, from 3.3% to 2.9%. Hungary's GDP contracted by 0.9% last year. The IMF adjusted its inflation forecast for Hungary this year to 3.8% from 3.7% forecast in April. The inflation forecast of 3.5% for 2025 has not changed. The inflation rate was 17.1% in 2023. As in April, the IMF continues

to calculate that unemployment will be 4.4% this year and 4.2% next year, following last year's 4.1%.

- 2. Hungary sets stricter environmental standards for factories: Hungary now enforces the EU's toughest air emission regulations for industrial installations, Portfolio reports, as the Ministry of Energy has revised emission limits for several highly toxic pollutants. New limitations on carcinogenic, mutagenic, and toxic-to-foetus (CMR) substances, as well as nickel, cobalt, and manganese (NCM), are stricter than Germany's rules. These revised standards allow environmental authorities to set emission limits up to five times stricter than before, regardless of the industry. The amendments were developed after public consultations and input from the National Environmental Council and the Hungarian Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The new rules apply immediately to new investments requiring environmental permits, while existing plants must comply by January 2028. Authorities will monitor compliance and take action against violations.
- **3.** EC initiates proceedings against Hungary over retail tax: The European Commission has sent Hungary a formal notice regarding its retail tax system, citing non-compliance with EU law. The Commission claims that Hungary's current practice violates the EU's principle of freedom of establishment. The investigation began in response to complaints from Spar and the Austrian government, alleging that Hungary's special retail tax was discriminatory. Spar argued that Hungary's 4.5% tax disproportionately affects foreign chains, while franchised chains pay only 0-1%. The company also objected to the price freeze, which forced retailers to sell certain products below cost. Hungary introduced a similar tax after 2010, which led to infringement proceedings, though the case was closed in 2014 without further EU action.

Tariff and Non-Tariff Barriers to Trade:

import Tariffs: The tariff rate on imports averages a comparatively low 1.1% of the value of goods (for international trade), which is the lowest figure regionally and third lowest figure in the whole emerging Europe region. Bosnia's import tariffs are harmonised each year with the combined nomenclature of EU and legislative regulations.

Anti-dumping and countervailing duties: in 2009 Bosnia introduced a law for the protection of domestic products against imports from Croatia and Serbia.

The law stipulates that safeguard measures were necessary owing to the influx of imports and the dumping of particular agricultural products from Croatia and Serbia, as well as a conceivable decrease in exports from Bosnia to Serbia.

Customs and Non-tariff Barriers: as a result of BiH not having EU member status event though the majority of its trading partners are EU member states, export and import supply chains will face more onerous border and documentary times and costs when compared with those of EU states.

The most salient risk is the high cost associated with import border compliance processes, which is higher than that of countries such as North Macedonia and contributes towards Bosnia's status as regional under performer in relation to customs burdens.

Businesses operating in BiH face a high import burden as infrastructural development, industrial capacity and diversification remains weak because of a dearth of fixed capital formation and a lack of political resolve in the country. Imports are driven by the country's need for complex machinery and its energy requirements, such as oil and gas, as well as metals and manufactured goods that cannot be produced locally.

To spur trade, Bosnia has exempted tariff payments from certain equipment that is being imported as part of share capital, with the exceptions of passenger vehicles and slot or gambling machines. To enjoy this benefit, foreign investors must submit a written request to the appropriate customs authority, along with evidence of the investment arrangement and registration of the foreign share. Alternatively, imports into one of Bosnia"s four free trade zones are exempt from customs duties and fees. These zones can be found at Vogosca, Visoko, Mostar and Holc Lukavac and clearly mitigate cost risks for businesses seeking to trade internationally with Bosnia.

Bosnia has applied to join the EU, and accession would open up trade, investment and growth opportunities for the economy. The country has already made good strides in establishing free trade and preliminary agreements to speed up the process of EU accession although, political instability threatens the prospect of EU membership in the medium term. Bosnia is also currently discussing the possibility of the creation of a Western Balkans Customs union with its South eastern-Europe counterparts.

1. Number of Tourists Increased by 10.8%: BiH was visited by 1,308,147 tourists in the eight months of 2024, which is 10.8% more than in the same period last year. Tourists made 2,767,926 overnight stays, which is 8% more compared to the same period in 2023, according to data from the BiH Statistics Agency. In the eight months of 2024 foreign tourists had 14.4% more visits. When it comes to overnight stays, domestic tourists achieved 1.5% Sarajevo. more overnight stays compared to the eight months of 2023, while the number of overnight stays by foreign tourists increased by 10.9%. In the total number of overnight stays, the participation of domestic tourists is 28.7%, and foreign tourists 71.3%. Most overnight stays by foreign tourists, were made by tourists from Croatia, 13.1%, Serbia 11.6%, Turkiye and Saudi Arabia with 9.6% each, Slovenia 5.4%, Germany 4.2%, the USA 3.2%, Italy 2.9% and Poland 2.8%, while tourists from other countries accounted for 37.6 % of overnight stays.

2. Annual Decline in the Volume of Industrial Production **5.8%**: The total industrial production in BiH in September 2024, compared to the previous month of 2024 recorded a decrease of 0.1%, and compared to September 2023 a decrease of 5.8% was recorded. Compared to the month earlier this year, the production of durable goods for wide use was higher by 2.8%, non-durable goods for wide use by 1.9%, and the production of capital goods by 0.6 %. The production of energy is lower by 4.8%, and the production of intermediate products is lower by 0.4%.

On an annual level, in September 2024 compared to September 2023, the production of non-durable products

for wide use was higher by 0.3%. The production of intermediate products was lower by 13.7%, the production of durable products for wide use by 4.7%, the production of capital goods by 3.5% and the production of energy by 0.5%, according to the data of the BiH Statistics Agency.

1. IMF predicts the growth of the GDP in BIH at 3% in 2025, below the regional average according to the latest World Economic Outlook report, in which BiH is in the middle of the Balkan countries in terms of expected growth, while Serbia (4.1%), Kosovo (4%) and Montenegro (3.7%) are at the top. The weakest economic growth is expected in Croatia (2.9%) and Slovenia (2.6%). Although the projected growth is positive, the IMF warns of serious risks that could slow the recovery, such as global geopolitical instability, trade barriers and inflation. The escalation of conflicts in the Middle East, as well as the growth of uncertainty in the global financial markets, represent additional challenges for countries like BiH that are dependent on foreign trade and the inflow of foreign investments. The IMF emphasizes that, despite declining global inflation, uncertainties in the global economy will require careful fiscal measures and reforms to ensure long-term growth. For BiH, along with the stabilization of the fiscal policy, reforms that encourage investments and strengthen the domestic economy's resistance to external shocks will be key.
