Overview of General Barriers to FDI in Hungary:

Regulatory barriers and administrative burden are affecting all sectors but particularly energy, construction, and banking: The overall administrative burden, including start-ups, negatively affects investment decisions. The instability of the regulatory framework, with frequent and unpredictable regulatory changes, creates uncertainty for investors and is hindering both internal investment and FDIs.

The Hungarian government imposes a 100% offset requirement for defined sector investments over HUF 1bln (EUR 2.8 mln). Efficiency of procedures in construction and environmental permits is insufficient; corruption also raises risk for investors. There is no requirement that investors must purchase from local sources, but the EU Rules of origin applies.

Ownership restrictions (all non-EU)

according to the 2014 Land Law, only private Hungarian or EU citizens resident in Hungary with a minimum of three years experience of working in agriculture or holding degree in agriculture can purchase farmland, which is limited to 300 hectares. All others may lease farmland. All farmland purchases must be approved by a local land committee and Hungarian authorities, local farmers and young farmers must be offered a chance to purchase the land first. Up to 1200 hectares for a maximum of 20 years may be leased.

Price controls in consumer facing sectors and others considered to be of strategic importance.

The Hungarian government regulates the prices of certain goods, setting the upper and lower limits to which the private sector must adhere. Sectors include energy, pharmaceuticals. Cuts on regulated utilities prices have put considerable pressure on private utilities companies, decreasing profit margins and adding to an increasingly difficult operating environment.

State intervention in Banking, energy, agriculture, media, telecommunications, and retail sectors.

Since 2012 government has invested in state-owned enterprises with the objective of lessening the participation of foreign-owned competitors, especially in the energy sector. From 1 Jan 2019, the chemical industry, the telecom sector, vehicle construction, metallurgy, optics and electric equipment production, the defence industry, water and sewage management, the financial sector, food industry and agriculture, production of construction materials, state administration, health care, wage management, transport and tourism sectors have been added. Foreign investors in the targeted sectors have expressed concerns that the tax regime has become unpredictable and the additional levies appear to have been aimed against some industries with a high level of foreign ownership.

Basic Rules of The Protection of Strategic assets Concerning Foreign investments

The European Commission has issued Communication 2020/C 99 i/01 in which it has given guidance to the Member States of the EU concerning the protection of Europe's strategic assets from the foreign direct investment, ahead of the application of Regulation (EU) 2019/452 (FDI Screening Regulation) which is applicable from 11 October 2020.Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/1298 of 13 July 2020 amended the Annex to Regulation (EU) 2019/452.

Hungary first adopted FDI screening mechanisms by act LVII of 2018 for FDIs violating the security interests of the country, then in the economic crisis caused by COVID-19, further screening rules were adopted for FDIs by Government Decree nr. 227/2020. (V.25.). According to the above, certain transactions concerning Hungarian-seated companies operated in strategic sectors by foreign investors shall be reported to the Minister of Finance and the acknowledgement of the Minister of Finance is necessary for the realisation of the acquisition of the shares until 31 December 2020. These transactions include the acquisition of shares, the increase of the registered capital and the transformation of the company. The strategic sectors specified by the Government Decree include energy, communication, finance, agriculture and food industry, healthcare, construction, transport industry, tourism, IT, mechanical engineering, etc. Those foreign investors that have shares in a company registered in the EU, European economic Community or in Switzerland shall only report the transaction if majority interest will be acquired indirectly. Conversely, the foreign investors wishing to acquire shares in a Hungarian company directly have to report any transactions by which the foreign investor would acquire shares at a ratio of at least 10% and the value of the investment is at least 350 000 000 HUF (appx EUR 1 mln). The Minister of Finance has 45 days or in specific and duly justified cases 60 days to decide on the acknowledgement of the transaction. Should the Minister provide a negative decision, then the exact reason of the prohibition is not required to be mentioned. Aggrieved investor may appeal before The metropolitan Court for a review of the prohibiting decision.

Banking, agriculture, defence and energy

The Hungarian government has publicly declared that reducing foreign bank market share in the Hungarian financial sector and tightening regulations governing NGOs are key priority areas. Several state-led initiatives over the past several years targeted the banking sector and reduced foreign participation.

Inflation no longer falling, set to rise: Inflation stood at 3.7% yr/yr last month, up from 3.6% in March, in line with the analysts' forecast, the KSH said. Compared to the previous month, prices went up by 0.7%. Among the largest food price increases, sugar was 30.4% higher, chocolate, cocoa and pork were 9.2% more costly than a year ago and the average price of restaurant meals went up by 8.4%. Fuel prices alone expanded by 6.6%. However, household energy became 4.5% cheaper, including a 9.2% drop for pipeline gas and a 2.9% drop for electricity. Core inflation (excluding energy and seasonal foods) dropped to 4.1% yr/yr from 4.4% in March. In the first four months, the average inflation was 3.7%. Analyst expect annual inflation index to rise above 4% in May 2024.

Court suspends Samsung factory's environmental permit	The Budapest District Court has ruled that the environmental permit issued for the Samsung SDI battery factory in God must be suspended until a higher court decides whether it violates environmental regulations. Local activists group the God-ERT association challenged the environmental use permit issued in December and requested that the permit not be in effect while the lawsuit is pending. The NGO argues that the operation of the factory does not comply with either Hungarian or European environmental protection standards. The plaintiff maintains that, in issuing the permit, the Pest county government office did not take into account the noise pollution of the plant that had existed for years, and was also extremely permissive regarding air and water pollution, as well as battery waste.
	2	4iG starts construction of satellite factory -	Hungarian aerospace company Remred, a member of the 4iG group, laid the foundation stone of its new satellite factory in Martonvasar on 6 May. The 4,000m2 factory, called Remtech, will develop, test and assemble satellites of up to 400kg in weight. The 1,500m2 facility will host high-tech laboratories equipped with vibration, shock, mechanical, thermo-vacuum, climatic, electromagnetic and acoustic testing devices. The innovation centre will start production in 2026, manufacturing 10-12 satellites per year, creating 85 high value-added jobs. It was announced last week that 4iGs space technology unit 4iG Ur és Technologiai had signed an investment and shareholders agreement to acquire a 45 percent stake in Remred, through a EUR 25 mln capital increase.

3	MOL inaugurates polyol plant (EUR 1.3 bln)	MOL inaugurated a polyol plant in Tiszaujvaros on 12 May, built at a cost of EUR 1.3 bln, its largest organic investment in the energy companys history. Chairman and CEO Zsolt Hernadi said at the ceremony. MOL received EUR 131 mln in state grants and tax incentives for the project which will create 300 jobs. MOL is the first company in the region to hold the entire plastic value chain in one hand, from crude oil extraction to polyol production, Hernadi said, adding that this strengthens the countrys sovereignty and future security of supply. German industrial group Thyssenkrupp supplied the innovative, environmentally friendly technology for the plant, and also installed a modern RnD centre at MOLs refinery base in Szazhalombatta.
4	China to take part in ambitious rail line project	China and Hungary signed agreements on 9 May on the construction of a railway ring bypassing Budapest, previously referred to as V0, and a high-speed rail link between Liszt Ferenc airport and downtown Budapest, as well as several other pacts. Foreign Minister Peter Szijjarto said preparations will begin for the construction of a railway ring bypassing Budapest in the framework of a joint Sino-Hungarian development. This is extremely necessary because significant Chinese investments are taking place in Hungary, basically in the eastern half of the country, but the products to be produced here will be marketed mainly in the western half of Europe, so transportation must be made more efficient and sustainable, he said.
5	Siemens opens Ft 26bn factory (EUR 67 mln)	On 23 May, Siemens Energy completed construction of a new multi-functional plant and training centre with a 1.5MW solar farm, in a Ft 26 bln (appx EUR 67 mln) investment project, boosted by a Ft 900 mln (appx EUR 2.3 mln) state grant. The German industrial giant will produce gas turbine combustion heads at the new facility in Budapest and will open a dual training centre. Siemens will continue to be a key player in the security of Hungarys energy supply in the future, as it won the tender for the supply of the control technology for the new Paks nuclear power plant together with French company Framatome, Minister of Foreign affairs and Trade Peter Szijjarto said at the ceremony.
6	Schneider Electric opens smart factory - (EUR 80 mln)	Schneider Electric, a specialist in digital automation and energy management opened an EUR 80 million state-of-the-art smart factory in Dunavecse. The 28,000m 2 facility will employ 500 people, significantly enhancing the companys European production capacity, and will export 90 percent of its output. The factory will be one of Schneider Electrics largest engineering-to-order (ETO) facilities in Europe.

At the Experts' Level meeting, Hungarian and Indian experts discussed areas of trade cooperation, policy reforms, business environment, ease of doing business, cooperation in various fields like agriculture, finances, science & technology etc. The meeting was held in hybrid format in which some experts from both sides could join online also. From the Indian side, delegates from from the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, New Delhi, ICAR, and Ministry of Information Technology (MeITY) as well as representative from the Embassy of Hungary, New Delhi joined. From the Hungarian side

			also there were representatives from various departments and concerned institutions. The discussions were completed in a friendly and congenial atmosphere. Both sides agreed on the need to further deepen cooperation in areas of mutual interest. Followed by a brief panel discussion between the two sides, the final Protocol was signed by H.E. Mr. Peter Sztaray, State Secretary for Security Policy and Energy Security, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and Mr. Rajendra Ratnoo, Joint Secretary, DPIIT on 18th October 2022. The next round of the JCEC is to be held in H1 of 2025 in New Delhi.

- 1. OECD lowers growth forecast: The OECD has lowered its 2024 GDP growth forecast for Hungary to 2.1% in its biannual economic outlook, down from 2.4% in its November report. Analysts expect growth to accelerate to 2.8% in 2025. The 2024 forecast is below the government's projection of 2.5%, but the 2025 figure is above the 1.8% average of OECD countries, the Finance Ministry pointed out. This year's economic growth is supported by lower inflation and rising consumption, but faces risks from changes in commodity prices and unfavourable developments in international trade, the OECD said. The report states that FDI investments in the electromobility sector are set to boost export capacities and lead to higher growth, adding that rising real wages and improving consumer confidence could also support the economy.
- 2. MNB lowers base rate to 7.25%: The MNB's Monetary Council cut the base rate by 50 basis points to 7.25% at its monthly rate-setting meeting on 21 May, in line with forecasts and in level with the easing of one month earlier. The interest rate corridor remained unchanged, as the council reduced the overnight deposit rate to 6.25% and the overnight collateralised loan rate to 8.25%, both cuts of 50 basis points. Deputy Governor Barnabas Virag said the rate-setters maintain that the volatile financial market environment and the risks to the outlook for inflation continue to warrant a careful and patient approach.

Tariff and Non-Tariff Barriers to Trade:

import Tariffs: The tariff rate on imports averages a comparatively low 1.1% of the value of goods (for international trade), which is the lowest figure regionally and third lowest figure in the whole emerging Europe region. Bosnia's import tariffs are harmonised each year with the combined nomenclature of EU and legislative regulations.

Anti-dumping and countervailing duties: in 2009 Bosnia introduced a law for the protection of domestic products against imports from Croatia and Serbia.

The law stipulates that safeguard measures were necessary owing to the influx of imports and the dumping of particular agricultural products from Croatia and Serbia, as well as a conceivable decrease in exports from Bosnia to Serbia.

Customs and Non-tariff Barriers: as a result of BiH not having EU member status event though the majority of its trading partners are EU member states, export and import supply chains will face more onerous border and documentary times and costs when compared with those of EU states.

The most salient risk is the high cost associated with import border compliance processes, which is higher than that of countries such as North Macedonia and contributes towards Bosnia's status as regional under performer in relation to customs burdens.

Businesses operating in BiH face a high import burden as infrastructural development, industrial capacity and diversification remains weak because of a dearth of fixed capital formation and a lack of political resolve in the country. Imports are driven by the country's need for complex machinery and its energy requirements, such as oil and gas, as well as metals and manufactured goods that cannot be produced locally.

To spur trade, Bosnia has exempted tariff payments from certain equipment that is being imported as part of share capital, with the exceptions of passenger vehicles and slot or gambling machines. To enjoy this benefit, foreign investors must submit a written request to the appropriate customs authority, along with evidence of the investment arrangement and registration of the foreign share. Alternatively, imports into one of Bosnia's four free trade zones are exempt from customs duties and fees. These zones can be found at Vogosca, Visoko, Mostar and Holc Lukavac and clearly mitigate cost risks for businesses seeking to trade internationally with Bosnia.

Bosnia has applied to join the EU, and accession would open up trade, investment and growth opportunities for the economy. The country has already made good strides in establishing free trade and preliminary agreements to speed up the process of EU accession although, political instability threatens the prospect of EU membership in the medium term. Bosnia is also currently discussing the possibility of the creation of a Western Balkans Customs union with its South eastern-Europe counterparts.

The Vice-President of the Foreign Trade Chamber of Bosnia and Herzegovina (VTK BiH) Zdravko Marinkovic held a meeting on 15 May in Sarajevo with Mayank Jagwani, the President of the Indo-Croatian Chamber of Commerce, and Baharat S. Rai, the Founder and General director of the Raizing Group company.

The discussed issues were the improvement of cooperation between BiH and India and the possibilities for opening an Indo-Bosnia Herzegovina Chamber of Commerce modeled on the one in Croatia. As it was pointed out, the Chamber would offer assistance for establishing a company, obtaining licenses and permits, and moving through legal and bureaucratic procedures in both countries. Raizing Group, as highlighted at the meeting, assists applicants in the complex visa application process, along with administrative and judgmental work related to passport, identity management, artificial intelligence, workforce training and recruitment, travel insurance, eSIM (Travellers Sim), dual citizenship and other services. The company has more than 50 branches in different countries.

100 thousand tourists visit BiH in March, an annual growth of 0.5%: Bosnia and Herzegovina was visited by 101,429 tourists in March 2024, which is 8% more compared to February 2024 and 0.5% more compared to March last year. Tourists spent 215,843 overnight stays in March this year, which is 3.1% more than in February, and 0.5% more than in March last year. The most overnight. stays were achieved by tourists from Croatia (25.3%), Serbia (16.8%), Slovenia (10.1%), Turkiye (5.%), Italy (3.7%), Montenegro (3.6%) and Germany (3.4%), which is a total of 68.5%, and tourists from other countries made up 31.5%, according to data from the BiH Statistics Agency.

1. Binas factory to employ 300 new workers due to new contracts: BiH Defense Minister Zukan Helez informed on 17 May in Bugojno that the Binas factory town will employ at least 300 new workers by the end of the year thanks to the new contracts signed with India. After the visit to Binas organized by the Ministry of Defense for the military attachés in BiH, Minister Helez pointed out that this factory is taking the lead in the defense industry of BiH, which, in turn, is taking the lead in the Western Balkans. He stated that he was particularly pleased that the company is adopting new technologies such as the development of igniters for small rockets for drones. "The military industry of Bosnia and Herzegovina is majority-owned by the state and will remain so, and I am glad that the United States companies have also taken ownership, but they will remain minority owners," he said. The director of Binas, Abaz Mandžuka, specified that they currently have signed contracts worth around 100 million KM, of which they plan to implement around 50 million KM (appx EUR 25 mln) this year, twice as much as in 2023. He said that they currently employ 420 workers, and if everything goes according to plan, another shift should be introduced by the end of the year.

2. The Central Bank expects moderate growth in economic activity in the medium term, and further weakening of inflationary pressures. In relation to the autumn round of projections from 2023, the projection of the growth of economic activity in 2024 has been corrected upwards, to the level of 2.6%, reaching appx 3.3% in 2026. The most significant contribution to economic growth is expected from personal consumption due to the growth of nominal wages and the inflow of remittances from abroad. In 2024, we project inflation of 2.6%, which is 0.3% lower than the round of medium-term projections from November 2023, and is consistent with the latest forcast on inflation in the short term. We expect a gradual weakening of inflationary pressures until the end of the projection horizon. We continue to emphasize that the assessed and estimated values of GDP and its components, as well as inflation, are exposed to a high degree of uncertainty", according to the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina.
